Eastside Division crime update

Capt. Justin Lane, the new head of the Eastside division for Tucson Police Department, said at a quarterly update for neighbors that the low number of officers available to respond to needs means TPD must find a smarter and more efficient way to do its work.

One way is to identify chronic offenders and their networks. It is not uncommon for a suspect to have as many as 40-50 associates with similar criminal backgrounds.

In addition to an emphasis on eliminating property crime in the area, Lane said the department is also engaging criminal prosecutors early in the phases of criminal investigations so they can work closely with detectives and officers.

Postal theft is a common problem throughout the city as an opportunity for identity theft, he noted. Protect yourself by paying attention to your bank statements and calling credit card companies to ask them to remove you from their mailing list. You can also download a free U.S. Postal Service mobile app. It allows you to track packages, hold your mail and schedule a pickup but importantly, it snaps a picture of everything that's being delivered in the mail to you so you know what's going to be in your mailbox and when.

Do your part! Don't hesitate to report suspicious activities as they occur by calling 9-1-1 or 88-CRIME.

Palo Verde Park, other updates from Ward 2

City Councilman Paul Cunningham recently met with PVPNA reps to talk about infrastructure priorities.

Here's a quick roundup on where things stand:

- **Splash pad:** The design to convert the children's pool into a splash pad is about 80 percent complete. Since it does not require lifeguards, the splash pad will have a longer season.
- **Picnic area**: Plans are in the works to extend the west side of the pool to incorporate a grassy knoll where families can picnic poolside. Stay posted for more information.
- Turf treatment: What isn't likely to happen this year is significant turf treatment. Although the turf is heavily used and there is clearly room for improvement, it is better off than other parks in the ward, so that won't happen immediately. Competition for limited funding is always the issue, and while Jesse Owens went through a major revamp by tapping federal funding through the Community Development Block Grant fund, this neighborhood does not qualify because it has lower levels of poverty and stress.
- **Road repairs:** Neighborhood roads were chip sealed in 2012 so there are dozens of neighborhoods in line ahead of us awaiting improvements. In the interim, if you have a request for general maintenance and pothole repairs, make your request to the City of Tucson at
