The pre-show jitters were worth it and we'll definitely be planning Park Fest 2020! Thanks everyone



One down...more to go! GoFundMe now available for our street sign campaign!





KUDOS TO THOSE CRIME WATCHERS IN RIVIERA ESTATES!

It doesn't take a lot of homes to pull off a neighborhood watch - in fact, somewhere around 8-10 is ideal! That's enough for a critical mass of peeled eyelids, but not so many you can't keep tabs on each other's homes.

Sgt. Jeremy Williams of the Tucson Police Department came out in 2018 to talk with neighbors along East Cooper Street about how they could form a neighborhood watch.

Aside from making easy adjustments to their homes to make it harder for criminals to enter homes or steal property, neighbors also agreed to share contact information and keep in touch when they see suspicious behavior.

The signs went up this month!

Public art to beautify pedestrian bridge at 22nd Street

City Council member Paul Cunningham reported recently that the Arts Foundation for Southern Arizona and the city Department of Transportation raised the possibility of doing a youth arts project over the summer at the bridge by Palo Verde High School.

Our Association has been invited to participate in the selection and oversight process.
