But we also believe these homes are a key to the memories of Tucson's past as well.


They tell the story of how the East Side developed in a particular window of post War World II development.

Pedestrian safety reminders

With heavier traffic in the area because of park activities and additional businesses like Community Medical Services, it's never a bad idea to review pedestrian safety tips.

These tips come courtesy of Tucson Medical Center:



- Look left, right and left again before crossing the street. Then stay vigilant to be sure motorists are stopping.
- Cross using traffic signals and crosswalks and put the headsets or phones away to reduce distraction.
- In many parts of the neighborhood, there aren't sidewalks. In that case, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible.
- Children under 10 need to cross the street with an adult. Every child is different, but most kids are unable to judge the speed and distance of oncoming cars until age 10.
- If walking when it's dark out, be especially alert and visible to drivers. Wear light- or brightly-colored clothing and reflective gear.
