Neighbors gather for planting of native vegetation in vacant lot



As an extension of Palo Verde Park Neighborhood's grant-funded water harvesting projects, Tucson Clean & Beautiful brought 16 native trees and other desert vegetation for the vacant lot east of the park.

TPD shares time prevention tips, trends at February meeting



Sgt. Jeremy Williams from TPD reported in the last six months, more than 2,100 incidents were reported - a third of them traffic stops along the arterials and many of them to check welfare or do proactive patrols. There were 15 burglaries reported, 4 stolen vehicles and 8 larceny calls in that time.

Sgt Williams encouraged neighbors to call 911 if they see suspicious activity. "Sometimes people are afraid to call 911 unless it's a big event, but we prioritize the calls so do not be afraid to call."

"The bad guys start to realize in which neighborhoods people are paying attention, and instead they go to the places where they know people are leaving car doors unlocked, or aren't closing their garage door, or where no one seems to care."

Crime prevention tips included:

- Put up exterior lights
- Lock your doors,
- Make sure your windows latch
- Do periodic safety checks around the home

"Bad guys like shadows. They don't like to be seen. And lock it or lose it. They're looking for crimes of opportunities so don't make it easy on them and don't get complacent because you don't want to be known as a neighborhood that allows these things to happen."
