How did our park get its name?

It's a reasonable question, since we're hardly overrun with palo verde trees!

In 1959, the park was unofficially called "Kellond Park" or "Miramonte Park." When the City of Tucson annexed the park from the county, they decided to give the park a name. A citizen's committee from members of the neighborhood was formed to make a recommendation to the Mayor and Council. There were three park names in the running:

- Palo Verde Park
- Coronado Park
- Van Horn Park (James Randolf Van Horn was a young soldier who went down with the USS Arizona at Pearl Harbor.)

The Mayor and Council approved Palo Verde Park on Sept. 21, 1959.
