Water conservation is the backbone of effective regional water management.

Irene Ogata from Tucson Water shared at a recent neighborhood meeting that while the city is making thoughtful choices about recharge and reuse, city water customers can also do their part by being mindful about water use.

Summer pool season runs through July, so there's still plenty of time to enjoy the pool.

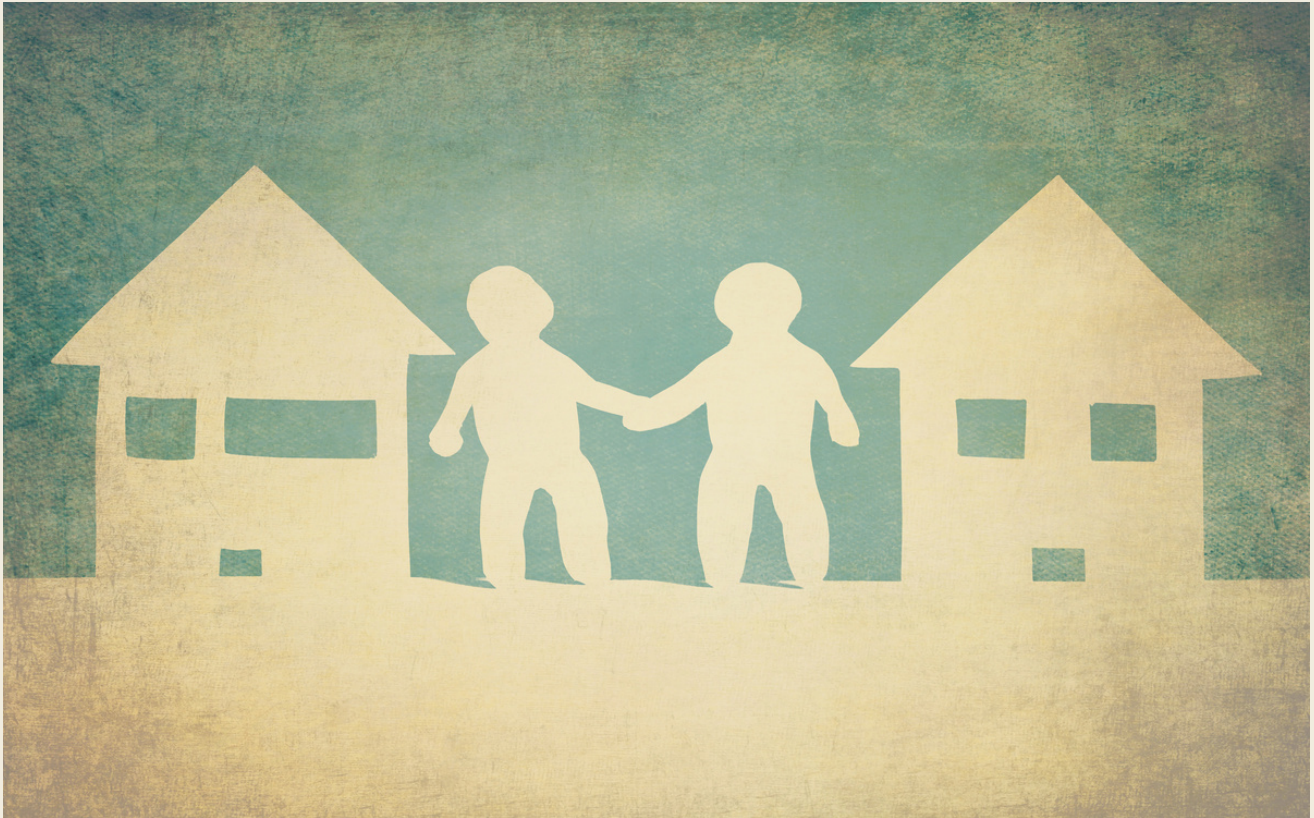
Recreational swim runs Tuesday-Friday: 1-5 p.m. and 5:30-7 p.m.
